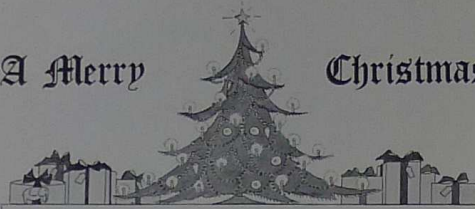

## MAYFAIR'S WINNIPEG

### LETTER

By TUXEDO

Winnipeg, October 1.

THE British Medical Association parties were by far the most elaborate this season. We had a whole week of them—to say nothing of an Indian Pageant, Hockey Match and Skating Club Carnival, and a garden fête at Lower Fort Garry with New-Canadian folk dancing on the lawns overlooking the river, and a war canoe race as the programme climax of the day.

The meeting brought seventeen hundred doctors to the city, including more than one thousand Canadians and two hundred Americans, so the four hundred overseas delegates and their wives were billeted in homes, and very welcome guests they proved to be.

Our own well-known physician, Dr. W. Harvey Smith, was this year's president of the British Medical Association, and quite the largest and most impressive function of the week was the presidential reception, held in the Parliament Buildings the opening night. All the convention delegates were there and their Winnipeg hosts, the company numbering upwards of five thousand. Preceding the reception, hundreds of

dinner parties had been arranged in private homes in honor of the distinguished visitors.

It was indeed a brilliant spectacle to watch the procession of guests hour after hour up the grand staircase to the upper reception halls. Many of the men wore colorful purple and crimson academic robes and hoods, and jewelled orders, while their ladies had donned evening gowns which this season's fashion decrees to be real evening gowns—form fitting, floor sweeping, fluttering.

Dr. Harvey Smith himself wore his Doctor's academic gown of cream and scarlet. Mrs. Smith, who received with him, looked exceedingly well in parchment satin cut on Grecian lines and showing a slightly uneven hemline, with a shoulder corsage of deep pink roses and orchids.

THE Lieutenant-Governor, Hon. J. D. McGregor, was present with Mrs. E. C. Harte. With them came a party of forty who had dined at Government House. These included Hon. Dr. Egbert, Lieutenant-Governor of Alberta.
