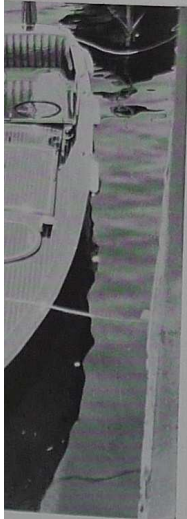

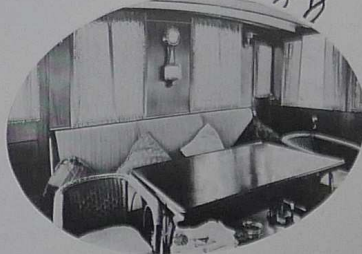


M. II, the fast Minett-J. R. Moodie, of Hamilton, a Scripps 100 h.p.

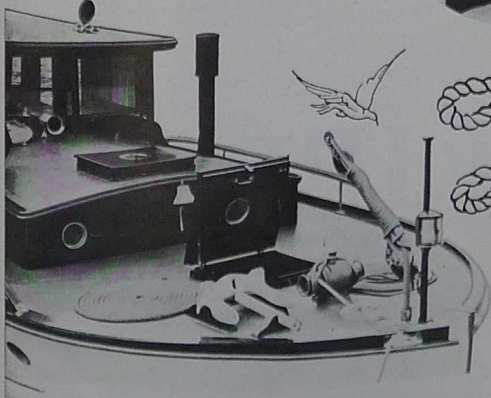


LOU—Deck House—showing one-man control
