block of the parliament buildings on Parliament Hill. He spends much time in conference planning details with Hon. J. C. Elliott, minister of public works, and the deputy minister, Mr. J. B. Hunter.

Nearly all the cabinet will be in Ottawa for the Jubilee celebration. Hon. Robert Forke, minister of immi-

gration, and Mrs. Forke, who have been on departmental business, and Hon. James Malcolm, minister of trade and commerce, and Mrs. Malcolm, are expected home from abroad. Meanwhile there is a skeleton cabinet here keeping the business of the country moving while individual ministers make trips with their wives to their own homes.
