The General continues. He explains that he has orders from Washington to be prepared for possible hostilities between sheep and cattlemen, as result of a new order pending. The new agent on the Indian Reserve has made a report to the effect that his predecessors have favored one particular outfit whose cattle have had the right of range upon the Indian Reservation. The Indian department at Washington have now under consideration application to permit 10,000 head of sheep to be substituted for the cattle. Pending deliberation, the General has orders to make a special investigation; to be prepared for possible riots and hosyilities; to make arrests if necessary, and to squelch all riots and violence.

"I am detailing you to Intelligence Service at T--- I want you to get us the low down on this matter."

"There will be a company of cavalry stationed at S--- the County seat. You will be adequately supported in whatever measures are determined by the Government.
