

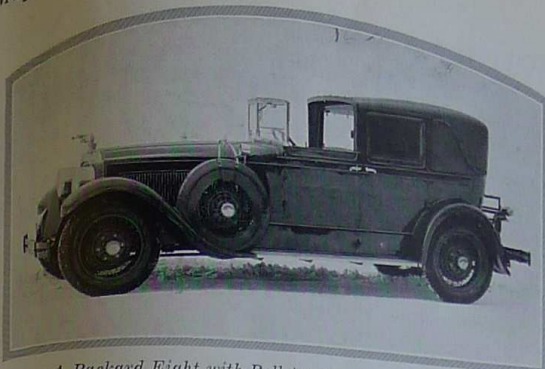

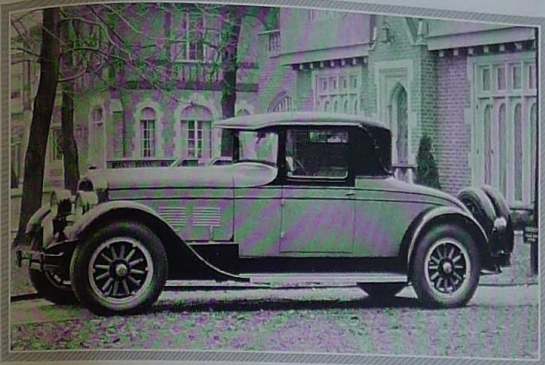

A Packard Eight with Rollston town car cabriolet body

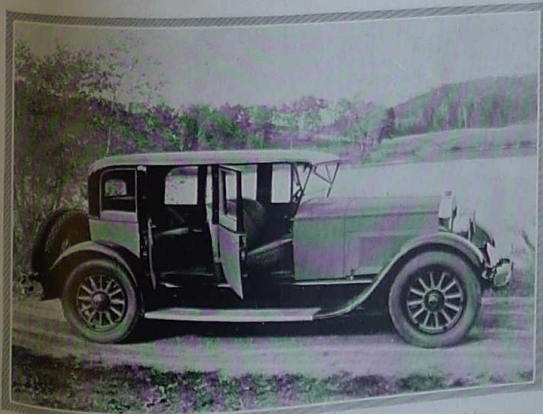
